- Lastly, students complete the writing prompt.








While Reading:

- How has the author used humor and exaggeration in the story?
- What is the significance of the "fine print" in the salsa jar?
- How do the illustrations enhance or add depth to the text?
- What lessons can be learned about preparation from the taco party?
- How do the dragons take accountability for their actions?

<u>After Reading:</u>

- Discuss the theme of responsibility in the story. What responsibilities did the host have, and how did he address them after the mistake?
- How does the author balance humor with a lesson in the story?
- How does the story address the concept of assumptions and oversight (like not reading the fine print)?
- · How do the dragons' actions after the party reflect their character?
- Why do you think the author chose to focus on dragons and tacos?
 - What other combinations could be interesting and funny?
- How do the choices of the main character drive the plot of the story?
- Discuss the importance of attention to detail, as highlighted by the salsa incident.
- Can you think of any other books or stories where a seemingly small oversight leads to significant consequences?



Dragons Love Tacos Drawing and Sentence Starters

Drawing Prompts:

- Draw a dragon holding your favorite type of taco.
- How do you think a dragon looks when it eats a spicy taco? Try to draw it!

Dragons Love Tacos Writing Prompts

- If you could talk to one of the dragons from the story, what would you ask them? Write a short conversation between you and the dragon.
- Imagine you were at the taco party with the dragons.
 Describe what you saw, heard, and how you felt during the party.
- What do you think happened the day after the taco party? Write a story about it.
- Pretend you are writing a letter to the host giving him advice for the next dragon taco party.
- If dragons love tacos, what food do you think unicorns, mermaids, or another magical creature might love?
 Write a story about that creature and their favorite food.
- Describe how you would make the perfect taco for a dragon. What ingredients would you use? What would you avoid?
- What if there was another food that dragons didn't like as much as spicy salsa? Write a story about that food and how the dragons react to it.
- Imagine you're throwing a different type of party for the dragons, like a pizza or ice cream party. Describe what happens during the party and if there are any unexpected surprises.

Dragons Love TacosWriting Prompts

- Dive deeper into the dragon's perspective. Write a diary entry from the viewpoint of one of the dragons attending the taco party.
- We know the aftermath of the spicy salsa incident, but how might the story have unfolded differently if the dragons had known in advance? Write an alternative version of the event.
- Do you think the host learned a lesson from the spicy salsa mishap? Write an essay about the importance of understanding and accommodating others' preferences, using examples from the story.
- Imagine a sequel where the host decides to organize another food-themed party, this time with a different mythical creature.
 Describe the preparations, the event, and any unforeseen challenges.
- Write a persuasive letter from the viewpoint of a dragon trying to convince people to eat more tacos.
- Reflect on the phrase "reading the fine print" and its consequences in the story. Have you ever missed a detail that led to unexpected outcomes? Write a personal narrative about it.
- Delve into the idea of making amends. The dragons help rebuild after the party. Write about a time when you had to make things right after an unintended mistake.
- Using the style of "Dragons Love Tacos," choose a different animal and food pairing (e.g., "Mermaids Love Muffins"). Describe the adventures and potential pitfalls of hosting a party based on that theme.

Dragon Charades

Directions:

- Write the following prompts on pieces of paper.
- Fold each paper and place them in a bowl or hat.
- Divide the class into two teams.
- Players take turns drawing a piece of paper and acting out the prompt while their team tries to guess. They cannot use any verbal cues or sounds.
- Each team has a set time limit (like one minute) to guess the prompt correctly. If they guess correctly within the time limit, they earn a point.
- Continue until all prompts have been acted out or until a set number of rounds.
- The team with the most points at the end wins.

Home Connection

Taco 'Bout Family Fun

Directions:

- Begin by discussing the story.
 - What was your favorite part of the story?
 - How would you feel if you were at the dragon's taco party?
 - What toppings would you put on a dragon-friendly taco?
- Together, decide on the ingredients you want in your tacos. Let the child decide on a special ingredient they might want to try, just like in the story.
- Prepare the taco ingredients together. Depending on the child's age, they can help with washing vegetables, grating cheese, or setting the table. Safety first: ensure any tasks given to the child are age-appropriate.
- Once all ingredients are ready, come together and assemble your tacos. Make it fun by perhaps blindfolding one person and having the other guide them to add ingredients (ensuring it's safe).
- Sit down and enjoy your tacos! Talk about the flavors and the fun you had making them. Discuss the similarities or differences between your taco night
 and the one in the book.
