BOOST COMPREHENSION

Use these questions, prompts, and engagement strategies to enhance read-aloud comprehension and social skills. The activities are ideal for prompting reflection on the text, igniting peer discussions, and making comprehension concrete through movement.

Transform your read-alouds into an immersive adventure in understanding and connection.

BEFORE READING

- What do you know about (book's theme)?
- How would you feel if (plot) happened to you or someone you care about?
- Looking at the cover, what do you predict will happen?
- What questions do the cover or title generate?
- How might this (vocabulary) word help us understand the story?
- What does a good friend (perseverance, or theme) mean to you?

DURING READING

- What do you predict will happen next? What makes you think that?
- How does (character) feel? What words or language helped you infer that?
- If you had one word to describe (character) what would it be? What have they thought, said, or done so far to infer that?
- What experience, event, or other book does this remind you of so far?
- So far, which event seems important?

AFTER READING

- What was the lesson or theme of the story?
- Why do you think the author wrote this book?
- How did the character feel at the beginning of the story compared to the end? Why did their feelings change?
- What was the most important event of the story, and why?
- What new ideas, thinking, or feelings do you have after reading?
- What questions would you ask (character)?

ENGAGEMENT STRATEGIES

- EMOTION MOTION: Assign an emotion to each corner of the room. Reread a part of the book, students move to the emotion they think best describes how the character felt at that moment and discusses their thinking with another.
- PLOT TWIST DANCE: Students think of an alternative ending. When the music plays, students safely dance around the room. When the music stops, they partner up and discuss their alternate endings to the story.
- FREEZE FRAME: Small groups of students select an important event from the story. They then, work together to create a living statue of that scene. They stay frozen until other groups correctly guess the story event.

Reading a repetitive story?

List repeated words on the board. Invite students to generate motions for those repeated words. Each time they hear that word read they make the motion.
